The goal of Project SEARCH interns is to find part to full time employment

Who it Serves

Project SEARCH serves students with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Typically, these are students who are on an Individual Education Program (IEP) and in their last year of high school eligibility or individuals who have exited school districts with services through Regional Centers. The most important criterion for acceptance into Project SEARCH is a desire to achieve competitive employment.
